Thank you for your prompt return of your art projects! I sent home today an “Art Project Return Folder” for you to take out your graded art (which will have my commentary), and place into it the art you completed (for review by myself).

I saw many people fishing and on the water this past weekend, and it made me think that you might enjoy a project about “Sea and Sky”.

Your next project is called “Maritime Art”. Google “Maritime Art” online to see examples of sailboats, big ships, yachts, war ships, submarines, and other watercraft on the seas.

Naturally, the skies were sailors’ best navigator, and the weather was the great challenge in getting to a destination on time or without delays. Sometimes ships sank.

YOUR STEPS TO CREATE A “MARITIME ART” PICTURE:

1. Use cool colors for the water and sky (blues, greens and purples) with any kind of blending and shading from light to dark or deep that you choose.
2. It is okay to add sea creatures to your ship’s picture – they exist!
3. Use warm colors (yellow, orange, red) for the sun and skies at sunrise, noon, and sunset.
4. Use whites, grays, browns, and blacks for stormy weather and slanted lines for driving rain, if you choose. Bright, calm, breezy, or stormy are all options for weather.
5. Yes, it is okay to use watercolor paints with your color markers and crayons.

You have two weeks to work on this, so remember to fill your page with your drawing and colors so that it looks like a kind of painting. **Craftsmanship counts!**
