Dear families:



The staff and students are enjoying Father Emmanuel's homilies as he quizzes the students and enlightens them about Advent and the significance of the Seasons signs and symbols. Advent wreaths are a favorite way to celebrate the month of December leading up to Christmas Day. There are many the rich meanings and symbolism embedded in the tradition. **SHAPE**: The circular shape

of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us. **NUMBER**: Four candles which are lit, one at a time, on each of the four Sundays of the Advent season. **COLOR:** Violet is a liturgical color that is used to signify a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice.

WEEKS: We pray that these four weeks leading to Christmas will bring you Hope, Faith, Joy and Peace.

- 1. The 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent symbolizes **Hope** with the "*Prophet's Candle*," reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- 2. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent symbolizes **Faith** with the "*Bethlehem Candle*," reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- 3. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent symbolizes **Joy** and is called the "*Shepherd's Candle*"; it is rose colored because rose is a liturgical color for joy.
- **4.** The 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent symbolizes **Peace** and is called the "*Angel's Candle*". When we light the final purple candle, it reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

As we embark on the Advent season, there are many opportunities to embrace and strengthen our faith. Please join in any or all of the Advent opportunities below to prepare for the birth of our Lord.


# CHRISTMAS SEASON – PLANNING


